Please ensure you pick up your cat or dog tag. Our community bylaw requires each cat or dog to be licensed by February 15.



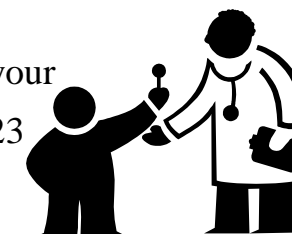
ATV and snowmobile and operators are reminded that these machines are allowed into Perdue ONLY for the purpose of **arriving** or **departing** to a point by the shortest route.

Council has agreed to participate in the regional working group to update our 'Official Community Plan'. As legislated, the 'OCP' is a document that is keystone in the planning process and essential in managing future growth and development. Along with receiving a comprehensive document that will enable Council to set development goals, a new Zoning Bylaw will be created to assist with regulating the use of land for the health, safety and general welfare of the residents of the municipality. As such, our Community Planner will be in our community in the coming months conducting consultations with residents on their views on various topics affecting our community. Residents will be notified as to when the consultations will occur and we encourage your input into your community.



## Waste Management:

### *What time should I have my residential cart out on collection day?*

Please place the cart roadside by 7:00 a.m. on Thursdays. If you're worried about being missed on collection day, feel free to place the cart along roadside the night before.

### *Where should I locate my residential cart for collection?*

Always place the cart with its wheels facing towards the curb or edge of roadwa

### *What cannot be put in my residential cart?*

- Hazardous material such as wet paint, chemicals or solvents
- *Absolutely no ashes*
- Sod, dirt, concrete or other heavy materials
- Construction or demolition materials including boards, roofing materials, or carpet
- Automotive parts, tires, oil filters or oil
- Tree clippings over 2' in length
- Liquids of any kind
- Animals or animal parts

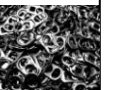
## E-mail Addresses Wanted!

## Water/Sewer Rates

**As a result of our aging water and sewer infrastructure, Council has applied for and received approval for a \$25.00/quarter 'infrastructure surcharge' that will be applied to all future water/sewer invoices. The revenue derived from the infrastructure fee will be added to reserves for future water and sewer replacement and upgrades.**



## **IT IS SOON TIME TO CLEAN UP THE YARD!**

The birds are singing, the snow is melting and soon the grass will be growing! Springtime is a time of renewed growth. Give your property the jump start it needs after the winter season by giving your yard a general clean up to remove garbage and debris, dead branches, broken appliances, and junked vehicles. Your neighbors will appreciate it!

If you have a junked vehicle on your property please make arrangements to have it removed. A junked vehicle can be described as: Any automobile, tractor, truck, trailer or other vehicle that

i) either:

1) has no valid license plates attached to it; or

2) is in a rusted, wrecked, partly wrecked, dismantled, partly dismantled, inoperative or abandoned condition; and

ii) is located on private land, but that:

1) is easily visible from off the property; and

2) does not form a part of a business enterprise lawfully being operated on that land
